

About the Cover

In his oil painting, "Adoration of the Holy Trinity," Albrecht Dürer gives you, the viewer, the opportunity to see a dazzling vision of Heaven with your very own eyes as it is happening at this very moment. Today it is housed in the *Kunsthistoriches* Museum in Vienna. The painting shows two distinct perspectives- Earth and in Heaven.

Looking up to Heaven is the reality that we experience in the liturgy of the Divine Service "with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven we laud and magnify your holy name evermore praising you and saying, 'Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of power and might: Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest!" The center and focal point of the entire artwork is the Holy Trinity. Each Person of the Godhead is seen individually but yet as One triangular unit. It is a synopsis of the Nicene Creed. God the Father Almighty in kingly crown presents His only-begotten Son crucified for our salvation, as the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove hovers above as the Lord and Giver of life! Surrounding the Holy Trinity are two rings of winged angels, the highest encircling the Holy Spirit while other multitudes of the heavenly host focus on the cross of Christ.

To the side of the cross, two distinct groups of saints are pictured. On the right John the Baptist leads the kneeling band of Old Testament kings and prophet, and King David and Moses. On the left side the New Testament saints following Mary as they wave palm branches of victory. Completing the Heavenly scene, the full company of the Holy Christian Church. Heaven and earth meet in the Divine Service. It is here that we participate in the present reality of Christ's victory over sin, death, and Satan. It is here that we join with all the saints in praise of our victorious Lord as we "sing with all the people of God and join in the hymn of all creation: Blessings, honor, glory, and might be to God and the Lamb forever. Amen. For the Lamb who was slain has begun His reign. Alleluia. This is the feast of victory for our God. Alleluia, alleluia, Alleluia!"


Seeing the crowds, [Jesus] went up on the mountain, and when he sat down, his disciples came to him.





Now are read the names of those active members who have received the ministry of Word and Sacrament:


