
# Ash Wednesday



"Now is the time of God's favor, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. 6:2b). Now! On Ash Wednesday the liturgy summons us to 40 days of preparation for the celebration of the Lord's pascha, His passage through the waters of death into life. Preparation for the Three Holy Days is a sign of a life committed to daily dying and rising. Preparation is a matter of urgency, not something to be put off. The bridegroom and bride are summoned to leave their bridal chamber! God hates nothing He has made. He forgives the sins of all who are penitent. Today the church "blows the trumpet" and summons all, both those who have followed Christ for many years and those who are just now seeking a place in His company, despite the urgency of daily demands, to cry out to the Lord, "Spare Your people!"

Repentance is a way of life. That life is characterized by "giving to the needy" (almsgiving), prayer, and fasting (self-denial). Faith is expressed in action; it is not merely intellectual exercise or emotional experience. Faith moves us to do the works of Christ. Faith is not a matter of public show but of communion with God and the giving of self as Christ gave Himself. Lent is not a burden but an opportunity for reconciliation with God, the washing away of sin, and the consecration of life to God.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and sets the tone of the season. It is a pointed call to repentance, which is to say that it is a return to the death and resurrection of Holy Baptism by way of confession and faith in the forgiveness of sins. Thus the imposition of ashes, from which the day receives its name, recalls both the mortality of sinful man and the

redemption of Christ, into which His followers have been baptized. This context of contrition and repentance, fully and firmly centered in the cross and resurrection of Christ Jesus, is the framework within which the Lenten fast is undertaken. A focus on Christ's Passion will not be chiefly an emotional or intellectual exercise, though the Word and Spirit of God engage both the intellect and the emotions. Rather, in faith the Passion is approached as the very heart of the Gospel, which the Lord our Savior has accomplished for us and now bestows on us with His Means of Grace.

## Communion Practice

On the basis of God's Holy Word, Hope Lutheran Church continues to practice the ancient, Biblical and confessional practice of close(d) communion as an opportunity to give joyful witness to our unity in the Christian faith. Guests who are joining us this morning and hold membership in one of our sister LC-MS congregations are invited to join us in the reception of this great gift. Please take time to introduce yourself to Pastor Sikora prior to the Divine Service.

Because the nature of the Lord's Supper involves unity of doctrine and because Christendom is currently divided by denomination over doctrine and practice, we are unable to commune those who hold membership in other denominations. For a further explanation of fellowship in the Lord's Supper please take a few moments to read the tract, "What About: Fellowship in the Lord's Supper" which has been placed in the pew rack. You are invited to take one with you for further study. May God bless your reception of His Word this morning.

We welcome you to church today, and it is a blessing to have you here. Our Lord has put His name upon us in blessing at the beginning of the Divine Service and is given to us in blessing again at our departure. May our time spent in service and prayer today be filled with the Holy Spirit; so that we may speak of God's love and glory to those in our lives.


**P** Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

Psalm 51:1–19 - Psalm 32:1-7- Psalm 121- Psalm 22



Therefore You alone, my Savior, Shall be all in all to me;


Search my heart and my behavior, Root out all hypocrisy.





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#### **Lenten Divine Service and Announcements**

Divine service setting three from Lutheran Service Book will be used. The Gloria In Excelsis is omitted during the season of Lent. In place of the traditional Kyrie, the canticle "Your Heart O God is Grieved #945 will be used. This canticle is an expansion of "Kyrie eleison" (Greek for "Lord have mercy"), a phrase that has been used by Christians for thousands of years. The Kyrie has been part of the Ordinary of the Mass with different musical settings used in different places and at different times of the church year. In this three stanza canticle style hymn, the first phrase addresses each of the persons of the Holy Trinity and is chanted by the pastor or cantor. The congregation sings the rest. The common use of this canticle is in place of the traditional Kyrie and when the Gloria in Excelsis is omitted.

The closing canticle "Nunc Dimittis" from DS3 will be replaced by the one stanza hymn "On My Heart Imprint Your Image" #422. This is the center stanza of a twenty-nine-stanza Passion hymn, "Bryderfrem, I huleSukke" by Thomas Kingo (1634-1703). Only this stanza has found continued usage in English. The complete Danish hymn invites people to ponder Christ's suffering for the sin of the world, to follow on the way to the cross, to see "God's unspotted Lamb....lifted on the cursed tree." The stanza before "On my heart imprint Your image." The hymn refers to the parable of the sower and the seed (Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23), with the prayer that riches, cares or pleasures not remove the image of Christ from the believers heart and centers itself on Christ and His crucifixion to save sinners.
