The message of the angels brings the shepherds (representatives and signs of "The Holy People, The Redeemed of the Lord" of all ages and nations who will follow them) to the Light (Is. 62:12). This Shepherd's Liturgy invites us to pass through the gates of our church into the joy occasioned by the Lord's proclamation of the birth of His Son.
